## Signals from the Commodore

Dear Members,

We have had a fun summer and some real exciting events. The club cruise was a great success and we had over 60 people at the dinner Saturday night. A big thanks to Jane Hamilton and Judy Overholt for all of your hard work in planning the cruise. The pig roast was also a big hit and a good time thanks to Tom Jayne and his helpers. Mother nature is not being very kind to us this year with limited rain and the resulting low water levels. We sounded the harbor in early June and we thought we were going to be OK without dredging again this year. The water levels, however, have been dropping since that time and are now under the long term average. The more serious issue is that the new forecasts indicate that the water will drop another foot by the last haul out. You have all received our notice and decision to modify the guidelines for the early haul. The Trust is trying to finalize the dredge permit and arrange for dredging but the water levels this year are forcing us to haul boats with drafts greater than 4 ft at the early haul.

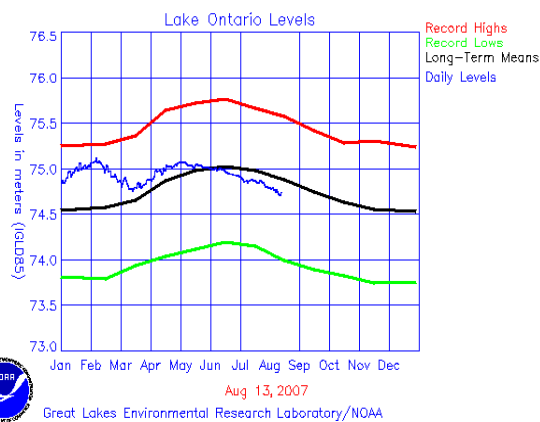
# Rear Commodore Report

## Notes from the Engine Room....

Well, I guess this is the price we pay for all of those beautiful sunny days on the lake... Back in July, we were tracking right on average lake levels and June harbor soundings looked good. However, the lack of rain in May and June caused me concerns, which have since proved to be well-founded. July and August have continued the dry spell and we're now well below average lake levels. This won't be a surprise to anyone by the time this article is published.



By early August I was getting reports of groundings in parts of the harbor. Michele and I did soundings before the pig roast on August 11<sup>th</sup> and found three areas of concern – in front of slips N3-N8; the main channel from P1-P8 and the east end of the south shore/south peninsula channel. These areas ranged from just over 4.3 ft to 5.5 ft. The Army Corp of Engineers estimates that lake level will drop another 12" by mid-October from the mid-August level of 245 ft.



The sad conclusion was obvious – even with dredging, boats drawing over 4.5 feet would be unable to move about the harbor by the second haul-out scheduled on October 20<sup>th</sup>. At the time of this writing, we're hoping to get dredging done before the first haul-out on September 22<sup>nd</sup>. Given the uncertainty, we've made the painful decision to put a draft limit of 4 ft and under for the second haul-out. Because of this late

requirement, we've extended the early haul signup deadline to September 1 – the same as the late haul due date.

One additional consequence... Although we don't have good count at this time, we do know that we currently have 26 members with boats drawing over four feet. This means the early haul will most likely run two days, Saturday September 22<sup>nd</sup> and Sunday September 23<sup>rd</sup>. We expect we will be able to complete the late haul on Saturday October 20<sup>th</sup>. It's interesting that a year ago we were wishing we had more boats signed up for early haul – I guess there's some truth to the saying 'be careful what you wish for!'

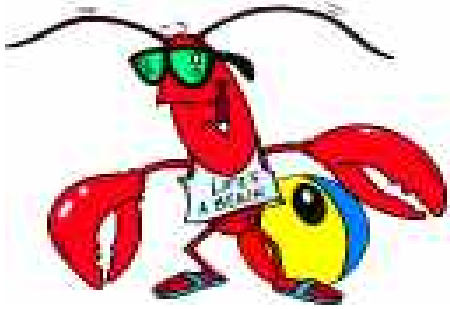

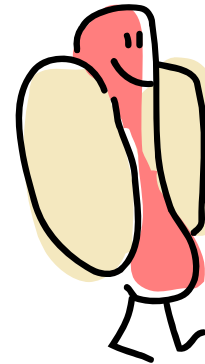

## 2007-2008 Haul, Storage, and Launch Form

Early haul-out is scheduled for September 22<sup>nd</sup> and 23<sup>rd</sup> if needed. Late Haul-out is scheduled for October 20<sup>th</sup>-21<sup>st</sup>. Start time for both haul outs will be 7:00 AM. Work crew assignments will be included in the September and October Soundings.

**Important Change:** Due dates for HLS forms and fees are August 15<sup>th</sup> for early haul and September 1<sup>st</sup> for late haul. Per PYC policy, forms postmarked after these dates will be assessed a 10% late fee. Checks will be deposited after September 1<sup>st</sup>.
