SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

1 RULES

The series will be governed by the rules as defined in The Racing Rules of Sailing.

2 NOTICES TO COMPETITORS

Notices to competitors will be posted on the official notice board located at The Pultneyville Yacht Club clubhouse.

3 CHANGES TO SAILING INSTRUCTIONS

Any change to the sailing instructions will be posted before 1730 on the day it will take effect.

4 SIGNALS MADE ASHORE

Signals made ashore will be displayed at PYC yardarms and or RC boat.

5 SCHEDULE OF RACES

5.2 One or more races per day may be sailed in either the spring or summer series.

5.3 The scheduled time of the warning signal for the first race each day is 1830.

6 CLASS FLAGS

Class flags will be:

Spinnaker - F flag

Genoa - G flag

7 RACING AREAS

Attachment C.1 shows the location of racing areas.

8 THE COURSES

The diagram in Attachment C.2 shows the PYC permanent race course, including the approximate bearings between marks. There is always the possibility that other marks may be used with the permanent race marks. Race committee will announce the course on VHF radio channel 9 within 15 minutes of the warning signal.

9 MARKS

Marks 1, 2, 3 and 4 will be orange cylinder 9 inches in diameter. The Zero mark is a white & orange cylinder 9 inches minimum in diameter.

10 AREAS THAT ARE OBSTRUCTIONS

The following areas are designated as obstructions: The area in and around the channel marks.

11 THE START

11.1 The starting line will be between the race committee boat and a designated pin.

11.3 Boats whose warning signal has not been made shall avoid the starting area during the starting sequence for other races.

11.4 A boat starting later than 5 minutes after her starting signal will be scored Did Not Start without a hearing. This changes rules A4 and A5.

12 THE FINISH

The finishing line will utilize the permanent race marks or other mark and the regular staffed Race Committee boat.

13 TIME LIMITS AND TARGET TIMES

The race will conclude 30 minutes after the first monohull crosses the finish line for each fleet. Any yachts still on the course will be scored as the "number of boats finishing within the time limit + 1". This changes rules 35, A4 and A5.

14 PROTESTS AND REQUESTS FOR REDRESS

14.1 Protest forms are available at the club house, located at racing bulletin board. Protests and requests for redress or reopening shall be delivered there within the appropriate time limit.

14.2 For each class, the protest time limit is 45 minutes after the last boat has finished the last race of the day.

14.3 Notices will be posted no later than 30 minutes after the protest time limit to inform competitors of hearings in which they are parties or named as witnesses. Hearings will be held in the club pavilion.

14.4 Notices of protests by the race committee or protest committee will be posted to inform boats under rule 61.1(b).

15 SCORING

16.1 The Low Point System of Appendix A will apply.

16.2 One (1) race is required to be completed to constitute a series.

16.3 (a) When fewer than 7 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores.

(b) When from 7 to 8 races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her worst score.

(c) When 9 or more races have been completed, a boat's series score will be the total of her race scores excluding her two worst scores.

17 SAFETY REGULATIONS

17.1 Check-Out and Check-In: Boats will check in with the race committee either in person on the water or via VHF channel 9, 10 minutes before the warning signal.

17.2 A boat that retires from a race shall notify the race committee as soon as possible.

17.3 The Fleet Captain and/or PRO (Principal Race Officer) may cancel or postpone racing if conditions, in their sole opinion, are unsafe.

17.4 The "PYC Racing COVID-19 Questionnaire" must be completed for each race and stored onboard for the duration of the season.

18 TRASH DISPOSAL

Boats shall not put trash in the water

19 RADIO COMMUNICATIONS

Except in an emergency, a boat shall neither make radio transmissions while racing nor receive radio communications not available to all boats. This restriction also applies to mobile telephones & portable internet devices.

20 PRIZES

Prizes will be awarded at the discretion of the Fleet Captain. Series winners will be awarded at the Pultneyville Yacht Club year end Cups & Flags. The Thursday Course Series Champion will be awarded to the lowest scoring boat in the Spinnaker Fleet.

21 DISCLAIMER OF LIABILITY

Competitors participate in the series entirely at their own risk. See rule 4, Decision to Race. The organizing authority will not accept any liability for material damage or personal injury or death sustained in conjunction with or prior to, during, or after the series.

22 INSURANCE

Each participating boat shall be insured with valid third-party liability insurance.
