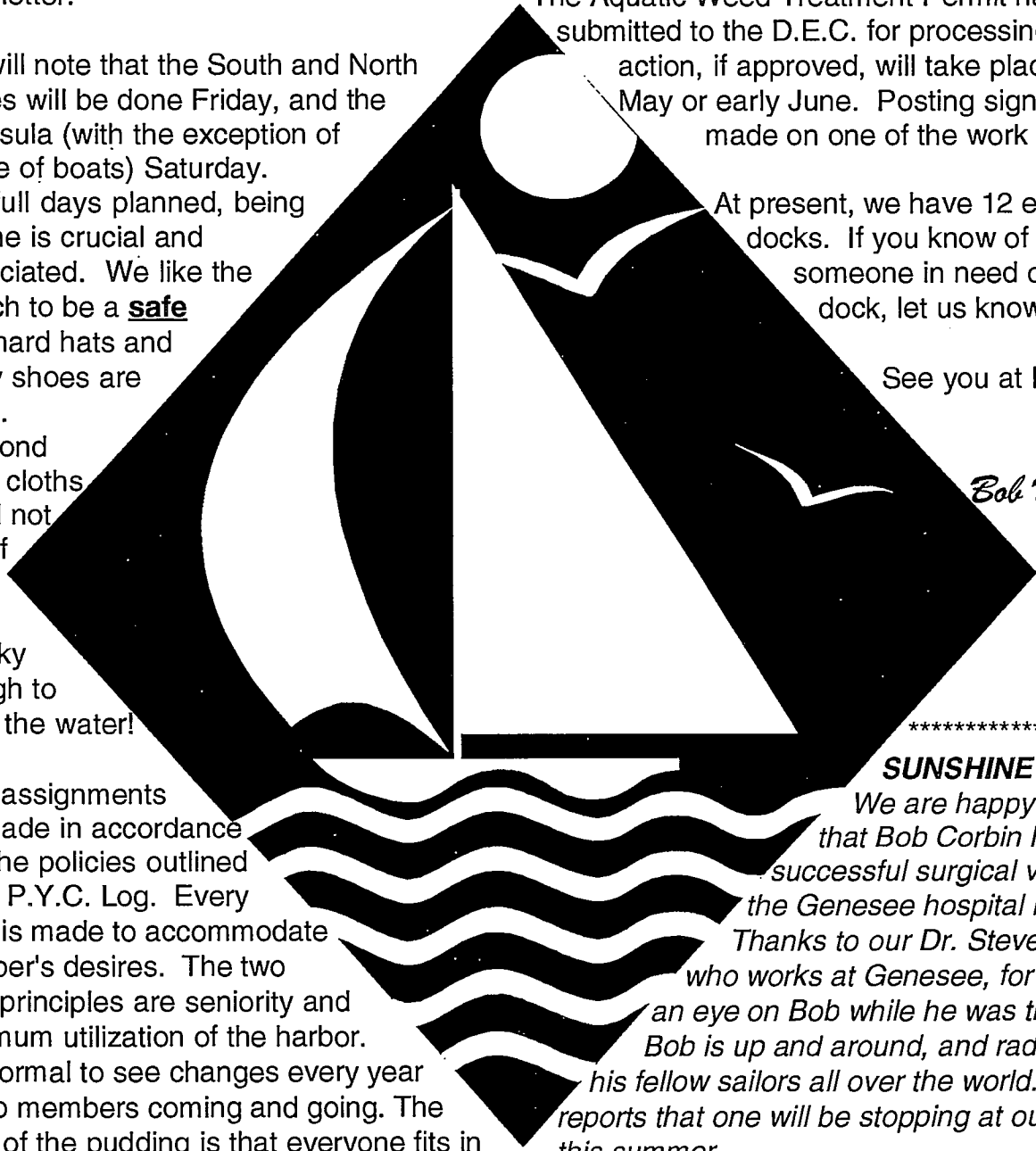
contact either Tom Bolt or myself so issues can be resolved. We want people to enjoy their time at the Club.

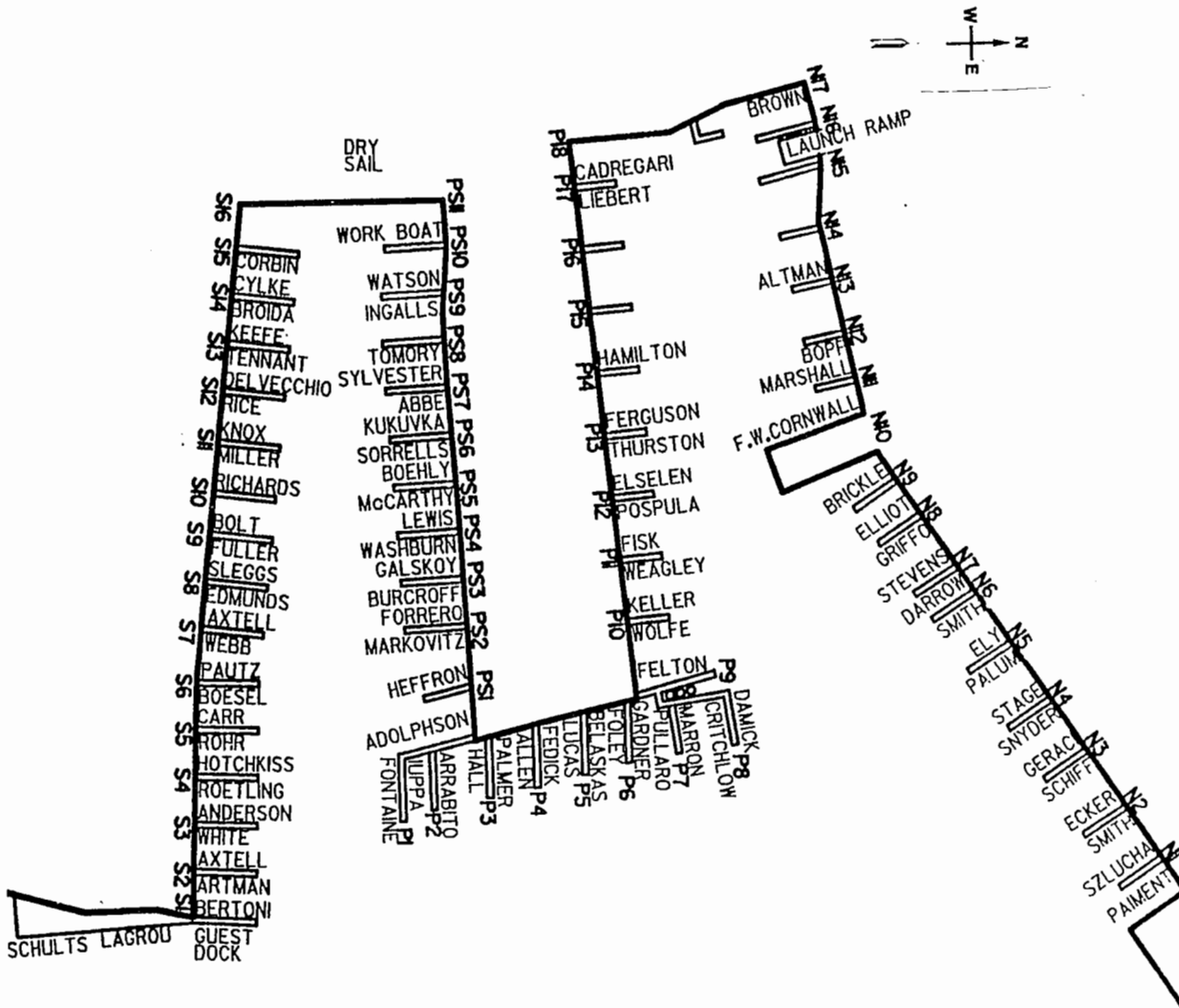
SUNSHINE NOTES

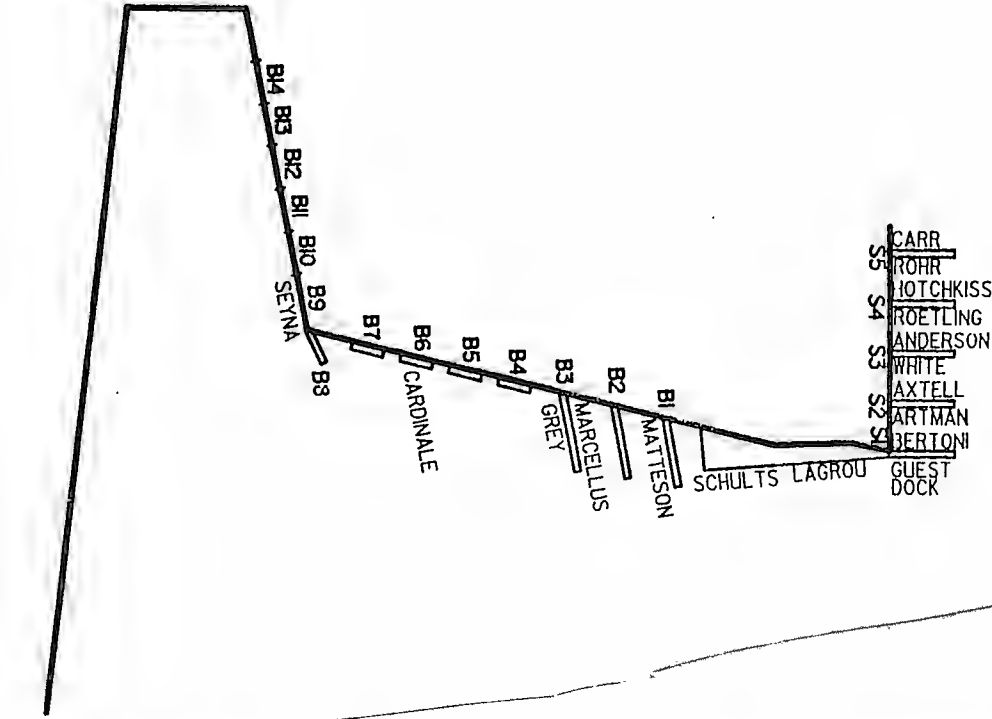
