Hello fellow PYC members! I am looking forward to an enjoyable experience as Treasurer of PYC. I grew up around PYC and am glad I can now contribute to its future.

Please remember when giving me a receipt for reimbursement, to attach a note with your name and what it was for. This will help me a great deal when I have to write the check.

This year the board decided to switch our banking to Canandaigua National Bank (CNB). CNB offered us a Business Choice account. The account is a combination of checking and savings. CNB

“sweeps” monies from one account to the other to maintain the minimum \$20,000.00 in checking. Therefore, the savings will always be at its maximum to earn interest. Their interest rates are very competitive with the club’s average CD investment.

NOTE: One way you as a member can help the club earn more interest on our savings account is to do your banking at CNB! If the club refers 10 or more new customers to CNB then our minimum required checking account balance would drop to \$10,000.00. That’s \$10,000.00 more in an interest bearing savings account! So, if you were planning on switching your bank, give Kathy Vasile a call at CNB at 585-670-9617 and tell her Pultneyville Yacht Club sent you. Then ask about the WorkPlace Banking program. CNB offers many nice features for personal accounts. (P.S. I am not getting any kickbacks for this promo- it is strictly for PYC’s benefit!).

PYC Is Going Down Hill *at Hunt Hollow*

We have made arrangements with Hunt Hollow Ski Club for a ski day on Friday, February 15th. You simply inform them that you’re a member of Pultneyville Yacht Club and you will be able to purchase an 8-hour ski pass for \$20.00. The club opens at 9:00 am and closes at 10:00pm. You can come at whatever time works best for you and ski for 8 hours.

There is a cafeteria that serves very good soups, sandwiches, chili and beverages. There is also a large outdoor grill if you would like to cook your own burgers, hots, steaks or whatever. If you need rentals, they are available for \$15.00 (Skis, boots and poles).

For those of you unfamiliar with Hunt Hollow, it’s on West Lake Road about 5 miles South of the end of Honeoye Lake. It has nice terrain for any level skier and usually very nice conditions and uncrowded slopes. You can drive right up to the clubhouse to unload your equipment and then up to a separate parking lot to leave your car.
