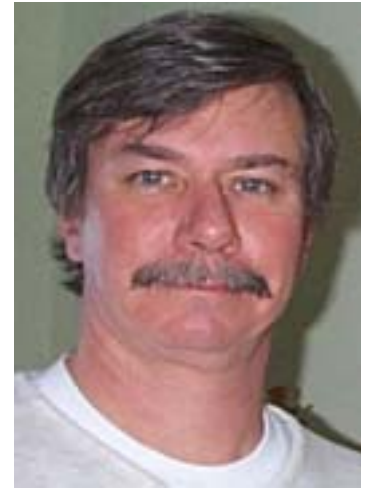

Hello, fellow members;

This year club finances are looking like more of a challenge than last year. I'll start with the good news. Tom Foley, a long standing member and our insurance agent, has just completed getting us a new insurance carrier. We are now insured through Chubb. Our previous insurance carrier decided to not renew any of our policies. The best part is that our new insurance is going to come under budget this year by approximately \$7300! Thank you Tom for all your hard work!



The bad news is we need new members and need to rent docks. We are 12 people shy of our budgeted membership. I am estimating that we will dip into our cash reserves by approximately \$10,000 by year-end. Between weed control, paying off our dredging from last year and dock repair we will definitely be spending our budget this year.

Recently I wrote a monthly timeline of tasks for the treasurer's position. This timeline will help future treasurers know what to expect and when to expect it. Keep in mind that the treasurer position will be available next year.
