Just a reminder, please check your cradles during cradle day to be sure they are secure and make any necessary repairs before haul.


We'll see you at haul out.

In other news, a couple of weeks ago we were able to remove the rock from the harbor entrance using the forklift and the cooperative labor of some of our members. It only cost about a gallon of gas for the forklift. Thanks go out to you all, with a special for R. Palum for the SCUBA Diving (to locate the rock and position the hauling hardware). During the same time we took that rock as well as 4 others (given by the Water Dept.) and relocated all on the lakeside of the point by the tree. They should help in reducing erosion in that area.






