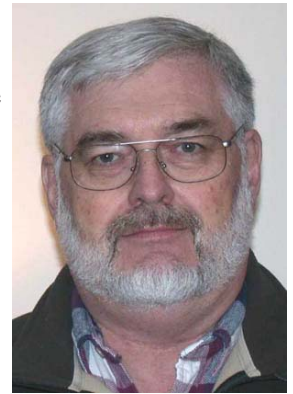


Signals from the Commodore

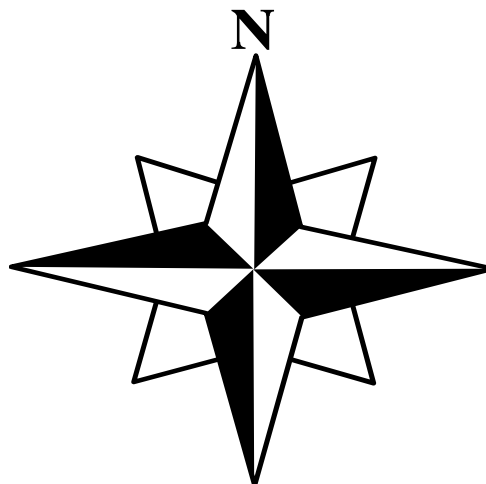

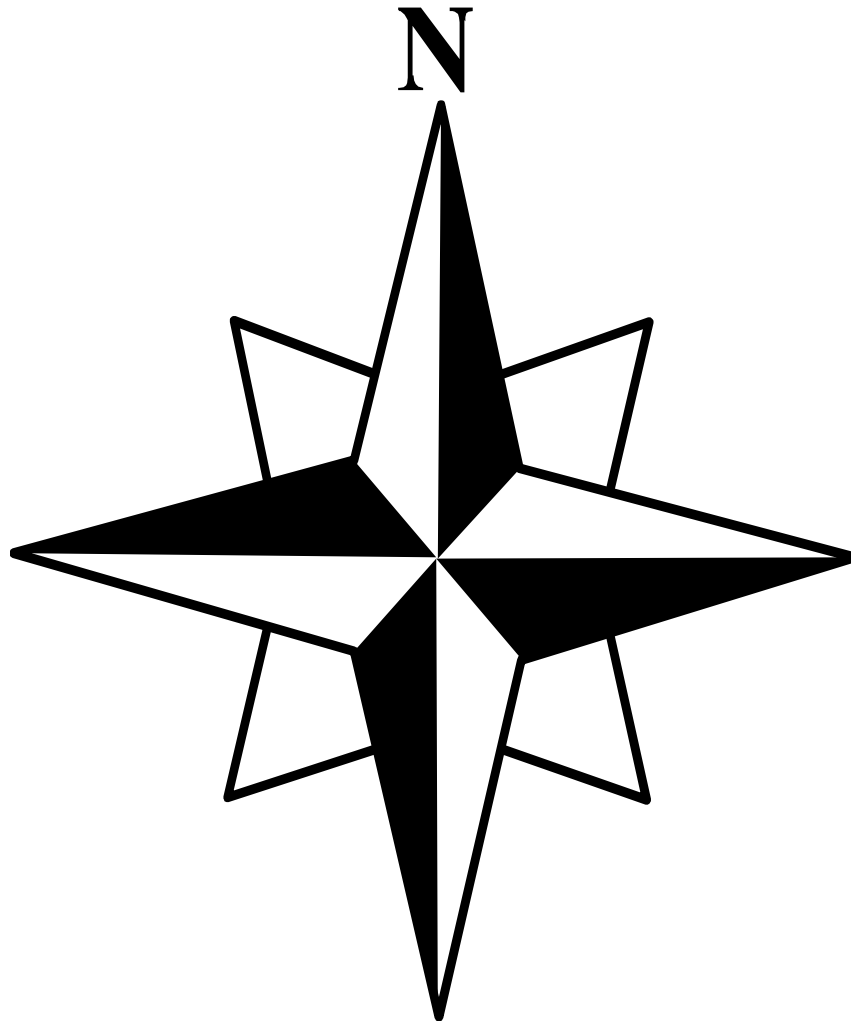




Rear Commodore Reports

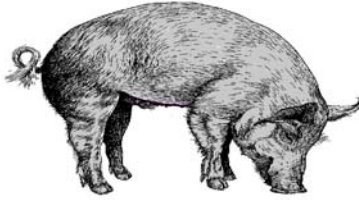

Member and Guest adult, \$12.00 each, Children 6 – 12, \$6.00 each, children 6 & under free.

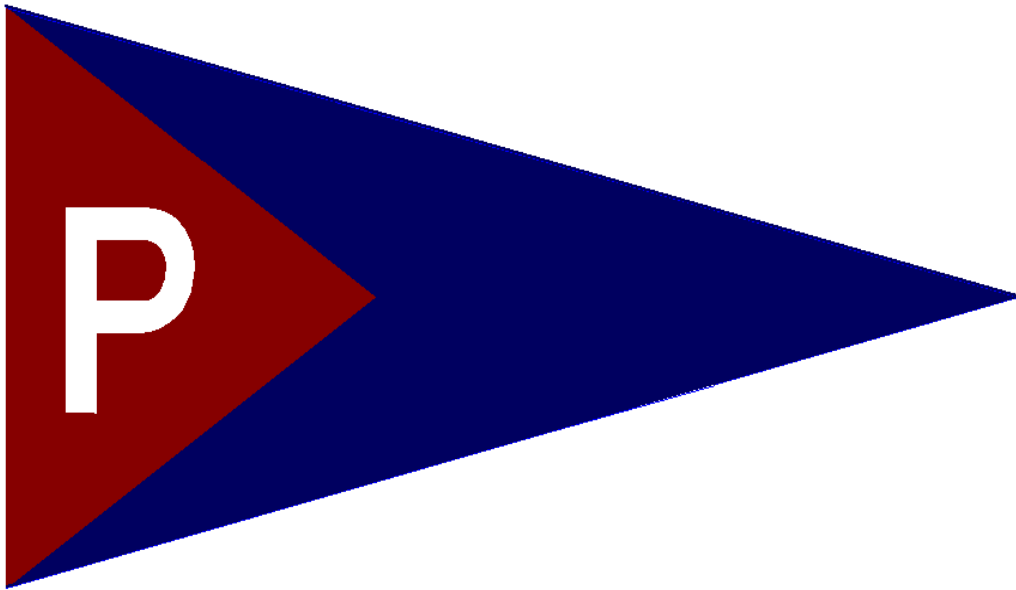
