


Notes from The Engine Room

Power & Sail Boat Skippers Needed For Hospice Regatta Event

This year's Lifetime Care Rochester Hospice Regatta events will once again include what is coined the "Community Cruise". It is about a three hour power or sail (as applicable) from the host yacht clubs, RYC & GYC, out to Lake Ontario and back followed by a Clambake. As PYC representative on the regatta committee, and on behalf of Lifetime Care Hospice, I'd like to invite and encourage all PYC boat owners to please consider joining in this year's Community Cruise on Friday afternoon August 17th, 2007.

The Hospice Regatta has traditionally been exclusive to sailboats only. Last year the committee voted to try something new and the first Community Cruise was instituted. It allows power and sail boats alike to get involved in the weekend's activities. It was a huge success so it is now going to be part of each future regatta.

The cruise gives Hospice sponsors an opportunity to go out on a boat and actually participate in the Regatta. Many sponsors are family members of lost loved ones that were recent or past receivers of hospice care. This cruise is therefore very special to them and has also been a very gratifying experience for skippers and crew to share in.

Skippers that "donate" their boats are essentially donating time for guests to have a ride on their yacht. Last year several boat owners hosting guests had wine and cheese or similar refreshments they provided. This is encouraged but not mandatory. As a skipper and boat owner you get to personalize the cruise in this area. It is meant to be fun and safety is paramount so weather conditions do play a factor. For example, if you want to constrain the cruise to the Genesee River only that is perfectly acceptable.
