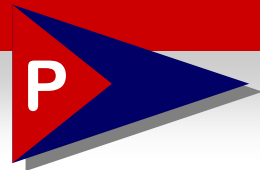

Signals from the Commodore

We don't ordinarily do politics in this space but the time seems right.

At our General Meeting on Saturday September 8, PYC Members elected Officers of the 2013 Executive Committee.

Please join me in extending a vote of appreciation and best wishes to **Doug Axtell (Fleet Captain), Kathy Fedick, (Commodore), Nancy Gong (Vice Commodore), Bob Hamilton (Treasurer), Mark Laffin (Rear Commodore) and Ellen Wozniak (Secretary).**

Current Officers engaged Members in a lively Q and A style discussion of the status of various 'capital' projects – including plans for harbor dredging - and the outlook for Club finances. We expect to further develop your ideas through the 2013 budget process and in our regular semi-annual meeting with the Cornwall Trust. These efforts are happening in parallel with review of the 2009-2013 PYC Lease. A lease group, chaired by **Dave Weagley**, has met once to prepare for an initial meeting with representatives of the Cornwall trust in late October.

Among the other items of 'unfinished business' is a previously mentioned review, by an ad hoc Committee, of Club Bylaws. We expect this in time

for our December General Meeting. Since time waits for no man, I thought that, in closing, I would share a current example – from the September General Meeting - of consideration of PYC Bylaws.

The following is the text of a motion to amend the Pultneyville Yacht Club By-Laws, Article V, Election of Officers, to add the concept of term limits. The current term is a one year period.

“Motion: To add the following to Article V as subsection 5.

Terms are limited to two consecutive in a particular office, and a maximum of three consecutive terms serving on the board.

Members are eligible to rejoin the board after a minimum of 1 year absence from officer duties.

In the event an officer leaves their position early, the prior position holder may fill in temporarily until the board appoints a replacement.”

Judging by the number of Members who weighed in at the time, there is very likely a broad and continuing interest in matters of Club governance and representation. Although this motion was tabled, we can expect to take it up again.

And again, best wishes to the class of 2013!

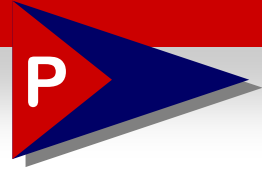
